Third annual Summit will focus on Learning in the Digital Space

Carson City, NV – [Registration](#) is now open for Nevada’s third annual Broadband Summit taking place in Reno in November. The event, called Learning in the Digital Space, will bring national, state, county, and local leaders together to discuss broadband expansion and the critical role technology is now playing in education.

The one-day meeting is scheduled for Monday, November 18, at the University of Nevada, Reno. The summit is being co-hosted by nonprofit [Connect Nevada](#) and the governor’s [Nevada Broadband Task Force](#).

In addition to speakers and interactive panels, there will be several opportunities for attendees to interact directly with grant awardees, providers, and stakeholders through Q&A and direct conversations.
